A. A man who was covered with leprosy said it to Jesus, and Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man (5:12-13)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in response to what: "Why are you thinking these things in your hearts?"

A. Jesus said it to the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, in response to them thinking to themselves, "Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?" (5:21-22)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?"

A. The Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect said it to Jesus' disciples (5:30)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance"?

A. Jesus said it to the Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect (5:30-32)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "John's disciples often fast and pray, and so do the disciples of the Pharisees, but yours go on eating and drinking"?

A. The Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect said it to Jesus (5:33)

S) Situation question: who said it, and in response to what: "Why are you doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?"

A. Some of the Pharisees said it, in response to Jesus' disciples picking some heads of grain on the Sabbath, rubbing them in their hands and eating the kernels (6:1-2)

S) Situation question: who said it, and what was the reply: "Why are you doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?"

A. Some of the Pharisees said it, and the reply was, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry?" (6:2-3)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the response: "Get up and stand in front of everyone"?

A. Jesus said it to the man with the shriveled hand, and the man got up and stood there (6:8)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "I ask you, which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to destroy it?"

A. Jesus said it to the Pharisees and the teachers of the law (6:9)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and about whom: "This man deserves to have you do this, because he loves our nation and has built our synagogue"?

A. Some elders of the Jews said it to Jesus, about the centurion (7:4-5)

A. Jesus said it to the messengers (two of John's disciples) (7:22)

A. The Pharisee who had invited Jesus said it to himself, and the reply was, "Simon, I have something to tell you" (7:39-40)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "You have judged correctly"?

A. Jesus said it to Simon (the Pharisee), in reply to, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt forgiven" (7:43)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Now which of them will love him more?"

A. Jesus said it to Simon (the Pharisee), and the reply was, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt forgiven" (7:42-43)

S) Situation question: who said it, among whom, and in response to what: "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

A. The other guests said it among themselves, in response to Jesus saying to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven" (7:48-49)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Your faith has saved you; go in peace"?

A. Jesus said it to the woman who lived a sinful life (7:50)

S) Situation question: who said it, and in reply to what: "My mother and brothers are those who hear God's word and put it into practice"?

A. Jesus said it in reply to, "Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to see you" (8:20-21)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and why: "Master, Master, we're going to drown!"?

A. Jesus' disciples said it to Jesus, because the boat was being swamped, and they were in great danger (8:23-24)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the response: "Master, Master, we're going to drown!"?

A. Jesus' disciples said it to Jesus, and Jesus got up and rebuked the wind and the raging waters (the storm subsided, and all was calm) (8:24)

S) Situation question: who said it, and about whom: "Who is this? He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him"

A. Jesus' disciples said it about Jesus (8:25)

S) Situation question: who said it, how, and where: "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, don't torture me!"?

A. A demon-possessed man said it, shouting at the top of his voice, in the region of the Gerasenes (8:26-28)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Return home and tell how much God has done for you"?

A. Jesus said it to the man from whom the demons had gone out (8:38-39)

S) Situation question: who said it, and what was the response: "Who touched me?"

A. Jesus said it and they all denied it (8:45)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Master, the people are crowding and pressing against you"?

A. Peter said it to Jesus, and the reply was, "Someone touched me; I know that power has gone out from me" (8:45-46)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in response to what: "Daughter, your faith has healed

you. Go in peace"?

A. Jesus said it to the woman who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years, in response to her falling at his feet and telling why she had touched him and how she had been instantly healed (8:47-48)

S) Situation question: who said it, and when: "Your daughter is dead. Don't bother the teacher anymore"?

A. Someone from the house of Jairus said it while Jesus was still speaking (8:49)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and about whom: "Stop wailing. She is not dead but asleep"?

A. Jesus said it to all the people, about Jairus' daughter (8:52)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the response: "Stop wailing. She is not dead but asleep"?

A. Jesus said it to all the people, and they laughed at him (knowing that she was dead) (8:52-53)

S) Situation question: who said it, and about whom: "I beheaded John. Who, then, is this I hear such things about?"

A. Herod (the tetrarch) said it about Jesus (9:9)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "You give them something to eat"?

A. Jesus said it to the Twelve, in reply to, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here" (9:12-13)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each"?

A. Jesus said it to his disciples, in reply to, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd" (9:13-14)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Who do the crowds say I am?"

A. Jesus said it to his disciples, and the reply was, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life" (9:18-19)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life"?

A. Jesus' disciples said it to Jesus, and the reply was, "But what about you? Who do you say I am?" (9:19-20)

S) Situation question: what said it, and about whom: "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him"?

A. A voice from a cloud said it about Jesus (9:35)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and when: "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son, for he is my only child"?

A. A man in the crowd said it to Jesus, the next day when Jesus and the disciples (Peter, John and James) came down from the mountain (9:37-38)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and when: "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?"

A. The disciples James and John said it to Jesus, when they saw that the people in a Samaritan village did not welcome Jesus (9:52-54)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the response: "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?"

A. The disciples James and John said it to Jesus, and Jesus turned and rebuked them (9:54-55)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name"?

A. The seventy-two said it to Jesus (10:17)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and why: "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"
A. An expert in the law said it to Jesus, to test Jesus (10:25)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and about whom: "Look after him, and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have?"
A. A Samaritan said it to the innkeeper, about the man who was attacked by robbers (10:35)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "Go and do likewise"?
A. Jesus said it to an expert in the law, in reply to, "The one who had mercy on him" (10:37)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"?
A. Martha said it to Jesus (10:40)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me"?
A. Someone in the crowd said it to Jesus (12:13)

S) Situation question: who said it, and what was the reply: "And I'll say to myself, 'You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry'"?
A. A certain rich man said it and the reply was, "You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?" (12:19-20)

A. Jesus said it to his disciples (12:22)

A. Jesus said it to a woman who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years (13:11-12)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and why: "There are six days for work. So come and be healed on those days, not on the Sabbath"?
A. The synagogue leader said it to the people, because he was indignant that Jesus had healed on the Sabbath (13:14)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Lord, are only a few people going to be saved"?
A. Someone said it to Jesus (13:23)

S) Situation question: who said it, and in reply to what: "Make every effort to enter through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able to"?
A. Jesus said it in reply to, "Lord, are only a few people going to be saved?" (13:23-24)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "Go tell that fox, 'I will keep on driving out demons and healing people today and tomorrow, and on the third day I will reach my goal'"?
A. Jesus said it to some Pharisees, in reply to, "Leave this place and go somewhere else. Herod wants to kill you" (13:31-32)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not"?
A. Jesus said it to the Pharisees and experts in the law (14:3)

S) Situation question: who said it, and when: "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honor, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited"?
A. Jesus said it when he noticed how the guests picked the places of honor at the table (14:7-8)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the

kingdom of God"?

A. One of those at the table with Jesus said it to Jesus (14:15)

S) Situation question: who said it, and in reply to what: "I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me"?

A. Another who had been invited to a banquet said it in reply to, "Come, for everything is now ready" (14:17,19)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son"?

A. The younger son said it to his father (15:21)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and about whom: "Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet"?

A. The father said it to his servants, about his younger son (15:22)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in response to what: "Look! All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends"?

A. The older brother said it to his father, in response to his father pleading with him (15:28-29)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "My son, you are always with me, and everything I have is yours"?

A. The father said it to the older brother (15:31)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "There was a rich man whose manager was accused of wasting his possessions"?

A. Jesus said it to his disciples (16:1)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in response to what: "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of others, but God knows your hearts"?

A. Jesus said it to the Pharisees, in response to the Pharisees sneering at Jesus (16:14-15)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Increase our faith!"?

A. The apostles said it to the Lord (Jesus) (17:5)

S) Situation question: who will say it, to whom, and when: "Prepare my supper, get yourself ready and wait on me while I eat and drink; after that you may eat and drink"?

A. One of you who has a servant plowing or looking after the sheep will say it to that servant, when he comes in from the field (17:7-8)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "The time is coming when you will long to see one of the days of the Son of Man, but you will not see it"?

A. Jesus said it to his disciples (17:22)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Where there is a dead body, there the vultures will gather"?

A. Jesus said it to his disciples (17:37)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "You know the commandments: 'You shall not commit adultery, you shall not murder, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, honor your father and mother'"?

A. Jesus said it to a certain ruler, and the reply was, "All these I have kept since I was a boy" (18:20-21)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "What do you want me to do for you?"

A. Jesus said it to a blind man, and the reply was, "Lord, I want to see" (18:40-41)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in reply to what: "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham"?

A. Jesus said it to Zacchaeus, in reply to, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount" (19:8-9)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and about what: "Put this money to work until I come back"?

A. A man of noble birth said it to ten of his servants, about the ten minas (19:13)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Sir, here is your mina; I have kept it laid away in a piece of cloth"?

A. Another servant said it to the king (19:20)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and when: "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here"?

A. Jesus said it to two of his disciples, as he approached Bethphage and Bethany (at the hill called the Mount of Olives) (19:29-30)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"?

A. Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said it to Jesus (19:39)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Teacher, we know that you speak and teach what is right, and that you do not show partiality but teach the way of God in accordance with the truth"?

A. The spies said it to Jesus (20:21)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Well said, teacher!"?

A. Some of the teachers of the law said it to Jesus (20:39)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees"?

A. Jesus said it to (some of) his disciples (21:29)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and in response to what: "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors"?

A. Jesus said it to his apostles, in response to a dispute arising among his apostles as to which of them was considered to be greatest (22:24-25)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "When I sent you without purse, bag or sandals, did you lack anything?"

A. Jesus said it to his apostles, and the reply was, "Nothing" (22:35)

S) Situation question: who said it, and what happened next: "Lord, should we strike with our swords?"

A. Jesus' followers said it, and one of them struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear (22:49-50)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "You also are one of them"?

A. Someone else said it to Peter, and the reply was, "Man, I am not!" (22:58)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Are you then the Son of God?"

A. The council of the elders of the people, both the chief priests and the teachers of the law said it to Jesus, and the reply was, "You say that I am" (22:70)

S) Situation question: who said it, to whom, and what was the reply: "Are you the king of the Jews?"

A. Pilate said it to Jesus, and the reply was, "You have said so" (23:3)

S) Situation question: who said it, and what was the response: "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!"?

A. The whole crowd said it, and Pilate appealed to them again (wanting to release Jesus) (23:18,20)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"?

A. One of the criminals who hung there said it to Jesus (23:39)

S) Situation question: who said it, and about whom: "Surely this was a righteous man"?

A. The centurion said it about Jesus (23:47)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "What are you discussing together as you walk

along?"

A. Jesus said it to those going to Emmaus (24:17)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken!"?

A. Jesus said it to those going to Emmaus (24:25)

S) Situation question: who said it, and where: "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon"?

A. The Eleven and those with them said it, in Jerusalem (assembled together) (24:33-34)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds?"

A. Jesus said it to the Eleven and those with them (24:38)

S) Situation question: who said it, and to whom: "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms"?

A. Jesus said it to the Eleven and those with them (24:44)
